Welcome to the new school year. A very special welcome to our Year 7 students as they commenced their first year at high school! They all looked so grown up in their high school uniforms and were given a big round of applause at the start up assembly. I have also been impressed with our youngest students when visiting classes and speaking with them in the yard. The new shade sail in the Year 7 Lawn has been very popular increasing the amount of shade in this area.



Our students looked amazing on the first day back at school. At the whole school start up assembly only three students were out of uniform! Many thanks to our parents and guardians for getting their children ready for school this year.



Year 12 Students Excel

Congratulations to our Year 12 students on their achievements in 2016 with 98% achieving an ATAR of 55 or Certificate II or III. Last year our ATAR students who applied for university were successful with Steven Paini the top performer with an ATAR of 91.05 followed by Nick Lay with 88.75 and Cooper Morrow 85.4. These boys all achieved their first preference with Steven off to UWA to study engineering, Nick to Curtin to study engineering and Cooper to UWA to study Natural and Physical Sciences. Other students off to university in 2017, include Blake Lucas who will study Business Management at Murdoch University, Krystal Butterworth to study Communications and Media and Rohani Rohmat to complete the Learning Skills Program. Jordyn Warren was accepted into Curtin University however, has deferred for a year. The median ATAR of 73.9 was the highest in the last 5 years. The improved performance in English was very pleasing and enabled most students to achieve front door entry to University courses.

The students who successfully completed Certificate II and III courses, 90% of those who enrolled, also did well with 14 successfully gaining employment, apprenticeships or traineeships for before the end of the 2016 school year. Six students gained employment with their Workplace Learning employer. It is terrific when local businesses employ our students as this is the desired outcome of the high school Vocational program in partnership with our employers.

Staffing for 2017

This year we welcome and congratulate eight teachers who won their positions for 2017 through the merit selection process. For 2016 we created a new Coordinator of Operations position which was won by Ms Diana Kirkland from Carine Senior High. Diana brings a wealth of school operational experience to Katanning and will also be teaching Humanities and Human Sciences. We welcome back Ms Tia Craen who completed her final teaching practicum with us last year. Tia has extensive mining industry experience and a passion for teaching students experiencing learning difficulties.

We welcome two engineers to the teaching team, Mr Marc Seatter who will be teaching maths and Mr Glenn Adams who will be teaching the Certificate I and II courses in Engineering. Mr Jadon Gielingh brings expertise in the teaching of General and ATAR physical education courses as well as experience with elite sports programs, while Ms Katy Steed brings experience teaching literacy and students with low literacy. Ms Tammi Rego joins the English team and brings her life and career experience in America and Alaska.



Ms Chantelle Delves joins the HASS team as a new graduate while Mrs Rachel Whitehouse won the permanent science position. Mrs Whitehouse will continue to develop her knowledge and teaching of Physics and Chemistry to ensure that we are able to offer these courses into the future. Mr Rory Calkin won the Year 7 teaching position vacated by Ms Gen Hulin who is currently teaching in London. As many of you would be aware Mrs Caitlyn Fitzgerald is on maternity leave after giving birth to Bronte George on 30 December 2016 so Ms Teresa McGrechan will take on the Follow the Dream Coordinator position until Caitlyn returns to work.

These teachers bring a range of professional and life experiences to our school which will complement the capacity that we already have across our staff. I am sure that you will make our new staff feel very welcome and will assist them as they acquaint themselves with their new school and town.

ACE PROGRAM

Achieving Curriculum Excellence (ACE) is a new Program at Katanning Senior High School that ensures academically gifted students are provided with an extensive and rigorous curriculum. The purpose of ACE is to target and support academically able students to achieve entry into a university course of their choice at the conclusion of Year 12 at Katanning.

Students are selected to be part of the ACE program based on their academic performance including NAPLAN test results and teacher judgement. Students in the ACE Program must maintain a high standard of academic performance and attitude, behaviour and effort. Communication regarding the program including review procedures, calendar of extra-curricular activities and events as well as liaison between teacher, student and parent is managed by myself in the ACE Program Coordinator role.

As university pathways is a major focus of the program, I am currently in the process of trying to establish a working partnership with a university in Perth. The goal is to provide students with opportunities to participate in a wide range of university focused activities via outreach programs run by universities. Distance may prove to be a challenge, but we will see how it goes.

A parent information session will be held during Week 5 or 6 of Term 1. All parents are welcome to attend to gain additional information on the program. Further information will be provided closer to the date.

SCITECH INCURSION

On Monday 6 February we were lucky enough to host SciTech who were touring with their "Beyond the Beaker". It was a free incursion and we are very grateful to SciTech and Chevron Australia, who fund the program, for extending the program to regional schools. The "Beyond the Beaker" sessions went for 45 minutes and all students in Year 7-10 attended. The presenters got students thinking about possible pathways in the science field after school. They had interactive examples of what people have achieved when combining two ideas together; for example, using PlayStation controllers to play an alternative online game called "Joust". Students had to try to hit each other's controller while moving around at the speed of the music.

There was also a video clips of people discussing the different pathways they took after school – including a mechanic, and a video clip of Bill Gates talking about the Janicki Omniprocessor – a plant that turns human waste into clean water and electricity.

2017 SENIOR SCHOOL BALL

This year the P & C Ball Committee are very excited to present the 2017 Senior School Ball "A Night Under the Stars". Year 10's 11's and 12's of 2017 are invited to attend this magnificent night on the 25 of March 2017. For the first time, the year 10's are invited to attend the evening. This has been decided in the hope to increase numbers for a more lively atmosphere on the night, to decrease ticket prices, and most importantly, to begin the year on a positive note for all senior school students and to build cohesiveness across the upper school.

A reminder to all students and parents/guardians that to be eligible to attend, the following requirements are to be met.

- All year 10's (2017) will return a signed permission form agreeing to the cocktail dress code for the year 10's so as to keep the year 11/12 formal dress tradition.
 - An attendance percentage of 90% or greater calculated from Wednesday 1 February to Friday 24 March 2016 inclusive will be required. This means that students can be absent for no more than 2.5 days during this time without a medical certificate.
 - Students must be in *Good Standing* as of the end of school on Friday 24 March 2017.
 - Students from KSHS in year 10 and up may partner a Year 10, 11 or 12 student, however they must meet the same attendance and *Good Standing* requirements.
 - Partners who do not attend KSHS will need to complete and submit an *Outside Partner Permission* by February 28, and must also be of year 10 age or older. Approval to attend will be at the discretion of the school administration. More information about this will be received early in term 1.
- All students and partners attending must complete and submit the permission and health forms by Friday 4 March 2016.

Bushfire Warning Levels

During a bushfire, DFES under instruction from the Shire and the Department of Parks and Wildlife issue community alerts and warnings for bushfires that threaten lives and property. They are issued once fire fighters have arrived at the scene and determine that there is a threat or potential threat to the community.

Understanding the Bushfire Warning System is extremely important in helping you and your family to stay alert and informed when a bushfire starts.

The Bushfire Warning System operates using four levels of warnings.



These levels change to reflect the increasing risk to your life or property and decreasing amount of time before the fire arrives.

Know the warnings and stay alert when a bushfire starts. Do not wait and see what happens, this could be deadly.

ARE YOU BUSHFIRE READY – WE ARE!

In 2017 the school is back on the Bushfire Zone Register and therefore must have a plan should the school be threatened by bushfire. If this did occur the school may be required to close for the day that a catastrophic Fire Danger Rating (FDR) is declared for the Shire of Katanning including the town. If a closure is to take place letters will be sent home with students as well as an alert on the MSN system and school website.

Year 8 school vaccination program

The 2017 school based vaccination program will be offered to both males and female students in year 8, throughout the course of the school year. The Department of Health recommends all eligible students receive vaccinations to prevent the following diseases:

- Human papillomavirus (HPV)
- Varicella (Chickenpox)
- Diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (Whooping cough)

Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) is a very common virus which affects both males and females; it is highly contagious and can cause a number of cancers in both males and females.

Gardasil is the vaccine available that can protect against some of the most common types of HPV. In particular, protection is proven against two HPV types which cause 70% of cervical cancer in females, and 90% of HPV-related cancers in males. The vaccine consists of three injections, over a six month period. It is important to have all three doses to maximise immune response and develop maximum protection.

Varicella is a single dose vaccine which will provide good protection against chickenpox – which is an acute viral infection that has sudden onset. Although usually a mild disease of short duration in healthy children, sometimes chickenpox will develop into more severe illness and is of risk to unborn babies if contracted in early pregnancy. It is safe to vaccinate someone who has already had chickenpox disease if unsure or the severity of disease is unknown.

Adacel will provide a booster dose to enhance protection against previously immunised childhood diseases diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis (whooping cough). Protection against pertussis decreases over time, and a booster dose is recommended to reduce the incidence of pertussis infection and circulation in the community.

Vaccination Consent Forms have been sent home with all year 8 students. Parents/legal guardians are asked to complete and sign the form and return them to school as soon as possible. Please complete the relevant section, sign and return even if you DO NOT want your child vaccinated. If you do not receive a Consent Form from your child by the end of week 2, please ask at the school office.

OLNA

Some students in Years 10, 11 and 12 will sit the OLNA in March. OLNA stands for Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment. In order to demonstrate the required literacy and numeracy standards for the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE), some students will be sitting the OLNA. You would have received information at the end of 2016 if your child is involved. To prepare for OLNA the School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA) provides practice tests.
