# FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Families, Students, and Community Members,

Welcome to our latest newsletter, which includes many examples of the great work many of our staff engage in to enrich the education of our students. It's hard to believe we are past halfway through the 2023 academic year, and it never ceases to amaze me how much work happens throughout a term.



We want every student to achieve success every day at KSHS, but for that to occur, we must create a culture of high educational expectations and the conditions for learning. Several teachers have been away on Professional

Development this term or visiting other schools to observe high-impact teaching practices. Our teachers are committed to excellence, including their professional development. This semester students will notice or see different teaching styles among our teachers, reducing variation from one class to another and making the teaching and learning environment predictable for all students. We aim to strengthen support for teaching and learning excellence in every classroom. To achieve this, we are working with Teach Well, who develop and nurture the capacity for high-impact instruction in teaching staff. Three staff members will undertake a Masterclass Series in High Impact Instruction commencing in Week 8 of this term. A Pivot Survey will enable students to give direct feedback to participating teachers about the impact of their teaching, what they are learning and identify where any gaps in skills or knowledge are occurring. We look forward to expanding on this robust instructional improvement program in 2024.

Following the Public-School return visit in Week 3 of this term, I am happy to report the reviewers found that we have made sufficient, sustainable progress and commitment to address the recommendations in the Learning Environment and Teaching Quality domains. This confirmation of our continual desire to improve as a school is the product of a committed team of staff, students, and a school community that wants the best for their local school. As a school community, we should be proud of our collective efforts and the initiatives we are implementing and working together to enable success for our students. The next Public-School Review will be in 2026.

This week we celebrated National Science Week with the Science Learning area putting the "fizz" into modern physics. We hosted 220 Year 5/6 students from our local primary schools, showcasing our STEM facilities, with our Year 8 students facilitating engaging and fun activities. This year, Katanning SHS is leading the GSSN Science Hub and is working closely with several local primary schools focussing on the Einstein-First Program. Professor David Blair and his team from The University of Western Australia visited the school on Monday 14 August, conducting workshops with all students and staff. We look forward to another successful Science Week and close collaboration with our local primary schools next year.

# **SENIOR SCHOOL**

Term 3 is a busy time in the school calendar with subject selections, OLNA (Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment), WACE tracking, and planning for 2024.

### Year 10 Course Selection

The Year 10 to 11 course selection transition has been completed. A sincere thank you to parents who made appointments to be part of the counselling process. The transition to Year 11 is a big step for students as it makes them think deeply about their future pathway as well as prerequisites. Your assistance and support in this process is invaluable.

### <u>OLNA</u>

In Weeks 2 and 3, Year 11/12 students who had not sat the Term 2 window had their first opportunity this year to demonstrate proficiency. We are pleased with the results from this window with several Year 11 students making progress as well as one Year 12 student achieving proficiency. Heading into the last opportunity in Week 8 and 9, we have 6 Year 12 students who still need to achieve proficiency in one or more components. This takes the percentage of Year 12 students who have achieved proficiency to 80% which is a great result for the school. To further support these students achieve their OLNA the school has invested in support classes, with two sessions a week for Year 11s and four sessions a week for Year 12s to enable them to achieve proficiency. A huge thank you to teachers for your ongoing support of these students.

### WACE Tracking

All Year 11 and 12 students have received written communication of their current West Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) tracker printout. This is to inform parents and students of where their child is at in their journey to achieve WACE. All Year 11 and 12 students were also addressed during their advocacy classes to further explain to them the school's expectations and WACE criteria. It is pleasing to note that all attending students in Year 12 are tracking well towards meeting the requirements of the achievement standard and will achieve their WACE if they achieve their OLNA. I am grateful to all parents for your ongoing support.

### <u>Exams</u>

Week 10 will see our Year 12 ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank), and UniReady students sit their Semester 2 exams. I wish them the best of luck in their preparations and advise them to access all the extra support being offered by the Regional Learning Specialists and their teachers toward their preparations. This is an extremely stressful time for students, and I am grateful to parents for your care and support during this time.

# THE HASS OFFICE HERALD

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"Narrow Escape for Defendant Facing Murder Charge, Man Sentenced for Attempted Murder of Rat"

The Supreme Court of Katanning Senior High School heard the case of Western Australia v Bairstow last month. The accused faced a murder charge for the discovery of a corpse in Dumbleyung.

The testimony of an expert witness and licensed medical professional confirmed that the deceased had suffered wounds of deliberate infliction.



The prosecution also alleged DNA evidence corresponding to Bairstow had been found at the scene. Nevertheless, Judge Quartermaine the Elder reminded the jury to remain impartial and consider the facts of the case before them.

Not long into the hearing, the defendant attempted to escape the courtroom but was quickly apprehended outside by the presiding Sheriff's Officer.

Many observers in the public gallery believed the fate of Bairstow seemed sealed: the prosecution team had built a strong case against the accused and had prepared damning questions for witness examination.



The defence counsel, however, was relentless in their objections to the Crown's questions and quick to counter witnesses on shifting details in their statements. As the trial continued, the prosecution was left in despair at the conflicting witness accounts and ultimately the foreperson of the jury announced the verdict of "Not Guilty" to spirited celebration from the defence counsel.



In the afternoon session, the court heard the case of Western Australia v Senihin. The accused faced a charge of attempted murder of Ratatouille, a beloved community citizen.

After a quick debate as to whether the rat was alive or deceased at the present time of the hearing, the court began its session. Emotion ran high in the courtroom as the Crown presented blood-stained fabric and a series of images depicting a bloody knife as exhibits to Judge Quartermaine the Younger. Not dissuaded, the defence counsel made their case for the innocence of their client and called their witnesses to give their testimony in the hope of acquittal.

A series of compelling narratives were presented to the jury. One witness gave an alibi for the defendant but admitted it was contingent on involvement in illegal activity.

Another witness suggested an unlikely friendship between the accused and the victim. Sensing a hint of key evidence, however, the lawyers for the prosecution pressed the witness to account for the presence of the defendant at the scene of the crime.

Unrest in the public gallery reached its height as the final witness rocked the courtroom by claiming guilt for the crime despite all previously heard evidence. At the end, the jury returned from a lengthy deliberation to declare the defendant guilty. The court will be adjourned for 4 weeks for the sentencing hearing.


Students have been busy expressing their creativity in English through various exciting activities!


