university aspirations by making applications to Curtin University and one receiving an early offer to pursue primary teaching.



YEAR 9 CAREER TASTER PROGRAM

On Wednesday 25 October, 10 students from Katanning Senior High School attended the Try Beauty Therapy Career Taster Program at South Regional TAFE Albany.

Students had the opportunity to hear from Emma, a Qualified Beauty Therapist about her career journey in the Beauty Industry and what a typical day entails.

The girls were shown the extensive salon training rooms and were very impressed with the range of treatment options and makeup available at the training salon.

Students were led on a tour around the TAFE campus and then learnt about how the skin is one of the bodies largest organs (weighing a whopping 3.6kg) and participated in a practical activity whereby they made their own body scrubs using all natural ingredients.

Whilst Mr Gaudin was very disappointed that he couldn't get his nails painted, a great day was had by all who attended! This career taster enabled the students to obtain a better understanding of what jobs are available in this industry and course options should they wish to transition into this industry.


MATHEMATICS

This evidence-based teaching strategy offers a distinct and unique opportunities for students to stimulate independent thinking, collaboration, and group work in a randomized group setting.

Initial trial with year 7 and 8 cohorts shows some positive results as students break down social barriers within the room, increase knowledge and active participation in mathematics lessons.

ENGLISH

We are excited to share with you the latest activities, themes, and assessments that the English Department at Katanning Senior High School has been facilitating with our students. It has been a busy and productive term, with each year level engaging in unique and enriching learning experiences.

In Year 7, our students have been studying persuasive speeches. They have been learning about the power of effective communication and the art of persuasion. Through this unit, students have developed their critical thinking skills and have been encouraged to express their opinions confidently. We are proud of their progress and look forward to seeing their persuasive speeches in action.

Moving on to Year 8, our students have been exploring the dangers of technology through the lens of persuasive speech. Education Perfect



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"DISCIPLES OF VULCAN EXPOSED PRODUCING RITUAL ARTIFACTS AT LOCAL SCHOOL"

In a shocking turn of events, a group of Year 8 Katanning Senior High School students have been accused of using the school art rooms for the purposes of worshipping the Roman God, 'Vulcan', by a staff member with strong links to the Ancient History Department at U.W.A..

The students, however, claim they were actually completing a Geomorphic Hazard assignment by building dioramas of earthquakes, tsunamis, and volcanoes.

According to the staff member, the students had been secretly meeting in the art rooms for weeks, using materials such as clay, paint, and glitter to create elaborate dioramas of natural disasters. However, it wasn't until a teacher stumbled upon the group mid-worship that their true intentions were revealed. The teacher, who wishes to remain anonymous, described the scene as "utterly bizarre."

"They had candles lit, incense burning, and were chanting in Latin," the teacher said. "At first, I thought they were just really into their assignment, but then I realized they were actually worshipping Vulcan."

The harrowing scenes of destruction included volcanic eruptions spitting boiling magma, tsunami waves swallowing cities, earthquakes ripping apart towns, and avalanches destroying pristine mountain sides.



One anthropological expert has suggested that the artefacts were prophetic visions akin to Doomsday predictions.

The students, who range in age from 12 to 13, have since been reprimanded by the school. However, some



members of the community are calling for a more severe punishment, citing concerns about the influence of ancient Roman gods on impressionable young minds.



"This is a clear case of indoctrination," said one concerned parent. "We can't have our children worshipping pagan deities in school. It's just not right."

Despite the controversy, the students themselves seem unfazed by the whole ordeal. "We were just trying to get into the spirit of our assignment," said one student. "We didn't mean any harm."
