Dear Students, Families and Community Members,

Welcome to another exciting and promising year at Katanning Senior High School. We are delighted to share that 72 Year 7 students have successfully settled into our school community. Our student population has grown impressively to 333 after Census Day on Friday 16 February 2024. This growth is a testament to the trust and preference our school enjoys within the community. We have acquired Education Perfect for students in Years 7-10 to ensure an optimal teaching and learning environment.



The 2024 Senior School Ball, held on Saturday, 17 February, was a resounding success. The collaboration between the P&C committee and the school has had a positive impact on our senior school students behaviour and bonding. We extend our gratitude to the P&C Ball Committee and all community members for their generous donations towards the School Ball.

We are pleased to announce that our School Business Plan for the years 2023-2025 is now accessible on the school website. We encourage you to take some time to familiarise yourselves with the strategic direction we've set for the school.

At Katanning Senior High School, quality teaching and learning are our highest priorities. In 2024, we are in the second year of our school improvement journey using the Fogarty EDvance program. This year, our focus is on the development of middle managers, who attended their first workshop accompanied by Deputy Principal Larissa in Perth on Monday 19 February. Building staff capability is our third Focus Area in the School Business Plan, and we remain committed to developing leadership capacity in current and emerging leaders.

In alignment with the Department's Quality Teaching Strategy, we have enrolled six staff members in the Teach Well Masterclass Series Cohort 54 this year. Our school has invested significantly in developing and implementing our Whole School Instructional Model (WSIM), with several staff members receiving training in high-impact teaching strategies.

During Week 3, our staff completed the Organisational Health Index (OHI) Survey for 2024, providing valuable feedback on our progress in building a positive school culture.

From **6 March to 28 March, 2024**, parents and students can provide feedback on our progress using the Fogarty EDvance Tell Them From Me Survey. This survey, developed by the Learning Bar, consists of three parts: collecting insights into teacher, parent, and student perceptions of classroom practice and students educational experience at KSHS.

Congratulations to Mrs Lisa Forman, elected as the School Board Chairperson, and Mrs Davina Davies, the newly appointed Secretary, following the School Board's first meeting for the 2024 academic year. As always, thank you for your ongoing support of your local High School.

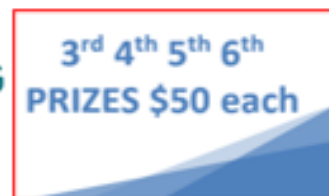
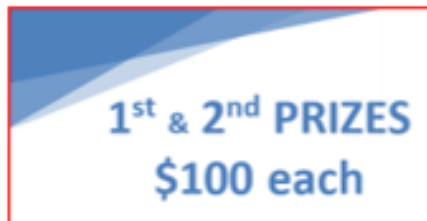

THE HASS OFFICE HERALD

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“Human Bones Discovered at Local High School; Expertly Excavated by Junior Archaeologists”

The students and staff of Katanning Senior High School were shocked this week to see an area roped off at the back of the school with caution-tape cordoning the zone. HASS teachers Tonga and Russell told the Department of Forensic Sciences to hold off on their investigation into the site as they knew exactly the right team for the job. The Year 7.1 HASS class met the announcement that human remains had been found on school grounds with faces full of grit and determination. Following the correct procedure for an archaeological dig, permission was granted for the dig team to begin an official excavation on site.



Wearing enclosed shoes and equipped with clipboards full of grid paper ready to record their findings, the archaeologists embarked on their dig.

Each team carefully recorded the exact location of their find within the square grid marked by pegs and string. The groups used professional dig equipment such as shovels, trowels, and brushes to unearth the remains.



Some particularly fine examples of delicate brushwork techniques were witnessed by the dig supervisors. The archaeologists made two major discoveries: bones and pictures of tree rings.

The archaeologists informed their supervisors that these strange pictures of trees could actually be used to date the age of the fossil. On return to the lab, the teams used the scientific dating technique of carbon dating to date their bones and discover that some of the bones were over 5,000 years old! With the use of dendrochronology, the archaeologists were also able to determine the climatic conditions of their findings by analysing the thickness of their tree rings.

Katanning Senior High School staff spent the rest of the day fielding calls from museums and archaeological associations across the world desperate to recruit these talented young archaeologists.



Staff and students at Katanning Senior High School were surprised this week to see the library hold a museum exhibit!

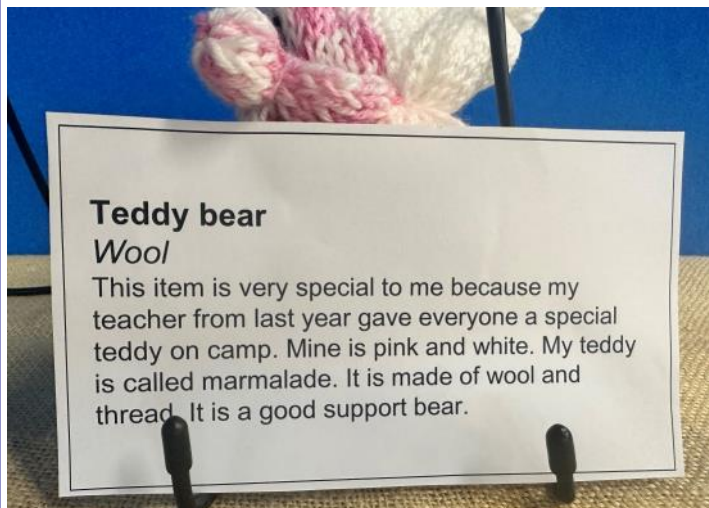
To begin this journey, students learned about primary sources, researched museums online, and watched interviews with curators who explained what makes a good exhibit.



This term as part of our study of History our Year 7 students have been learning all about artefacts, sources, and evidence.

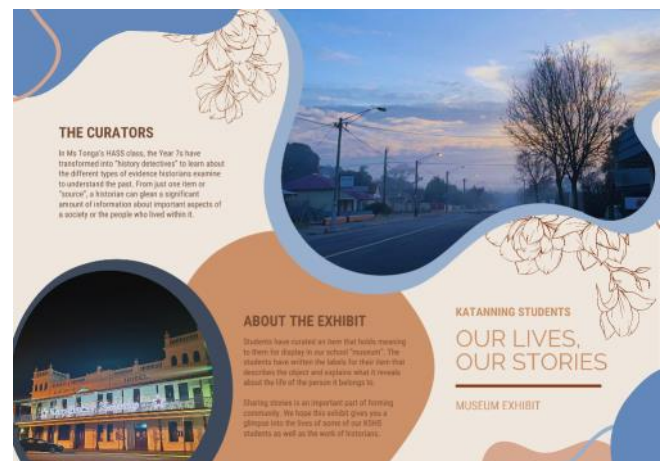


The students then chose an artefact (a human-made object) with special meaning to them or somebody in their lives. Next, they studied their artefact and made historical inferences, recording it all on exhibit planning sheets. The final result of the Katanning "Our Lives, Our Stories" exhibit offers a glimpse into the lives of these young curators and their shining future in the wonderful world of HASS.

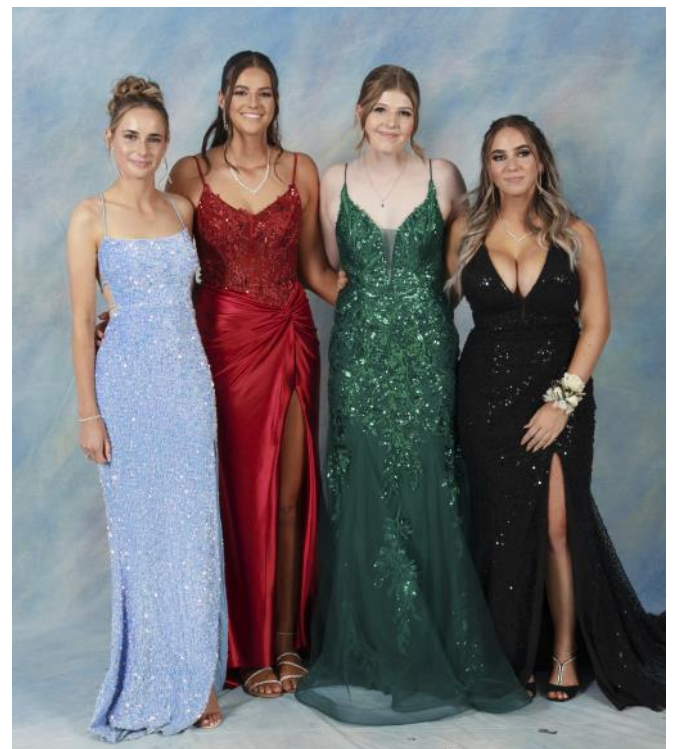
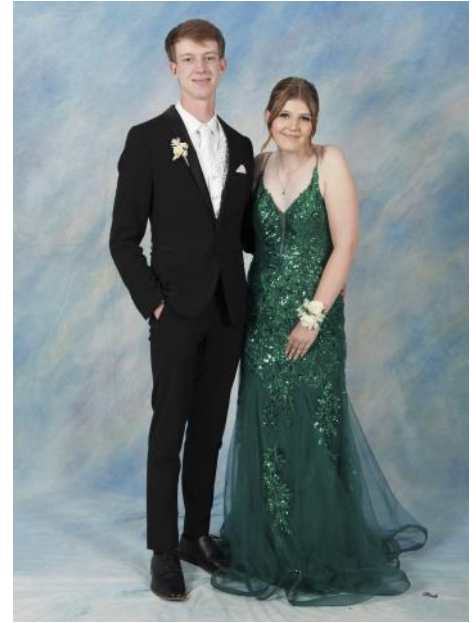

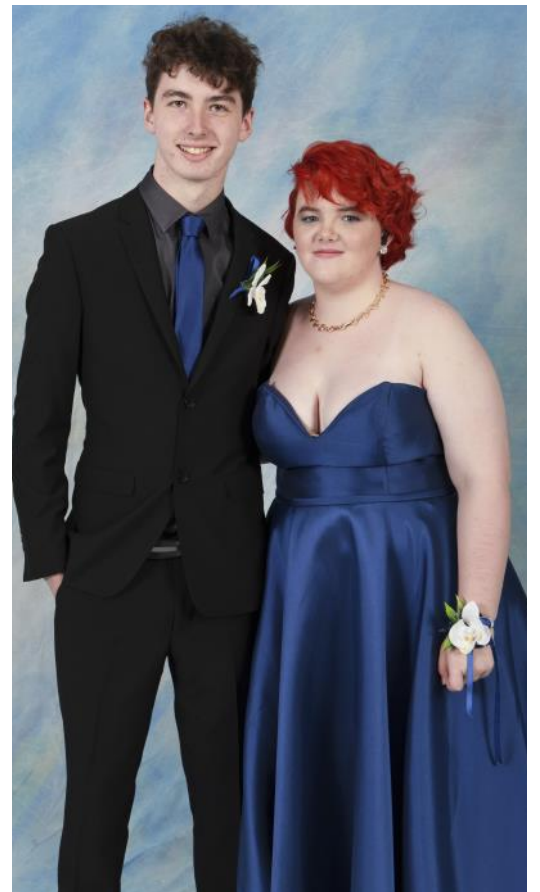

WHOLE SCHOOL INSTRUCTIONAL MODEL

Last year, Katanning Senior High School embarked upon a new teaching and learning journey to reshape the school's instructional framework. Examining cognitive science, individual teaching and learning strategies, and the practice of master teachers, a model for high-impact classrooms at Katanning Senior High School was developed, trialed, and continues to be strengthened. Now, our refined Whole School Instructional Framework empowers staff in their moral purpose of working together to enable success for all students.

Inspired by leading educational research, Katanning Senior High School has formally adopted principles of instruction and the pedagogical strategies of Explicit Direct Instruction (EDI). Experts such as Barak Rosenshine emphasise the efficacy of focusing instruction on critical content, helping students to organise knowledge by presenting material in smaller units, and following the model of gradual release of responsibility (seeing students move from teacher modelling to guided then independent practice).

The core focus for Katanning teachers is to strive for full participation by all students in the classroom. Students have learned participation tactics and engagement norms such as choral response (every student responding aloud), Pair Share (turning to speak to a partner, using the full sentence prompt provided), and choral reading (reading aloud as a whole class). All classrooms have been equipped with whiteboards, markers, and erasers as well as hand-held remotes for teacher use.

With the use of whiteboards, a teacher can quickly scan a whole classroom to identify the answer of every student to their question.

New instructional power point templates have been designed and implemented successfully in HASS across Years 7, 9, and 10. Students will experience elements of the instructional framework in some classes across learning areas and full implementation is planned for all classes by the end of 2026.

These power point templates require students to engage in an action to show their understanding every two minutes and with the use of frequent Hinge-Point Questions after the delivery of content, teachers are able to check for understanding after every piece of new content, for every single student. This is a revolutionary model of instruction and has already shown exciting benefits for students.

Our first cohort of teachers attended the Teach Well Masterclass Series in High-Impact Instruction in 2023, with the second cohort joining in 2024. The school maintains an ongoing commitment to continue to upskill staff in professional learning, classroom observation, and mentoring.
