Arrival at School & First Day of Term 1



FIRST DAY OF TERM

- Students must arrive **after 8:30am**. Supervision is not provided prior to this time. If early arrival is unavoidable, students are required to check in at reception on arrival.
- Start of the Day Siren is at 8.50am.
- Students will be greeted by the Katanning Senior High School team and provided with individual timetables to begin the day.
- Students to be prepared for class – carry all stationery in pencil case, bring bag, books, files, change of HPE clothes, etc.
- **No canteen is available** – bring own refreshments, food and water bottle/drinks.



DRESS CODE / UNIFORMS

Students should be proud of their school and identify with it by wearing the school uniform.

School uniform items include jackets, polo shirts, jumpers, pants and shorts.

- Beanies are so available through the P&C Association.

Physical Education – For hygiene reasons all students will be required to change prior to and after PE periods. A phys ed polo is available and can be worn for all phys ed lessons and school carnivals. The polo is the colour of the student's house.

Home Economics – All students must wear covered shoes in accordance with safety and health guidelines.

Art – All students should wear closed in shoes and protective over-shirt to Art classes.

Woodwork, Metalwork and Industrial Arts – Student regulations require the wearing of hard covered shoes. Safety glasses are compulsory in these classes.

PLEASE NOTE – NOT PERMITTED:

- For occupational safety and health reasons, Students must wear covered footwear at school. Thongs, slides, sandals, Crocs and Ugg boots are prohibited.
- Any logo, slogan or advertising is not acceptable as part of the dress code. This includes all items of clothing (e.g.; pants, sweaters, hats, bags, etc.) with brand names and/or brand signature stripes.
- Any item of clothing that promotes or advertises alcohol, drugs or inappropriate material is strictly prohibited.
- Leggings, jeggings, tights are not permitted.
- Denim or denim style fabrics are not permitted.
- **Hoodies** are not allowed to be worn at school. Students who wear a hoodie will be recorded as out of uniform and this may affect their Good Standing. Students will be asked to remove the item and hand it in to the administration office. They can collect their hoodie after school as they leave.

Piercings: Occupational Safety and Health concerns may prohibit the wearing of certain piercings by students at school. Some school activities may require that all piercings are removed for the duration of the lesson.

Stationery & Personal Items

Each student is responsible for bringing their own stationery and personal supplies as required for their subjects.

Items may include; workbooks, course specific materials eg calculator and stationery eg ruler, pens, pencils, erasers, exercise books, USB's.

- Personal items and Booklist stationery can be purchased from a supplier of your own choice.
- Alternatively, orders can be placed online using the enclosed Campion order form. Costs have been reduced to parents in lieu of a school rebate.

School Contributions & Charges

At Katanning Senior High School, we believe that a strong partnership between families and the school is key to delivering a rich and diverse educational experience.

Your financial contributions play a vital role in helping us provide high-quality resources, engaging learning environments, and expanded opportunities for all students.

Timely payments allow us to plan effectively and continue offering a broad range of programs that support student success.

Voluntary Contributions (Years 7-10)

To help cover the cost of materials, services, and facilities used in core educational programs, we ask families to contribute up to \$235 per student.

- These contributions support subjects such as English, Maths, Science, Humanities, Arts, and more.
- Additional costs may apply for optional programs and electives beyond the core curriculum.

Compulsory Charges

In addition to core contributions and charges, Katanning Senior High School offers a range of **optional items and voluntary approved requests** that enhance student experiences.

These are listed on the enclosed Contributions and Charges sheet and are designed to support enrichment across academic, social, and extracurricular areas.

Compulsory charges apply to:

- High-cost electives in Years 7–10
- All courses in Years 11 and 12

While there is no set maximum, we aim to keep costs as affordable as possible. The Payment Schedule for High-Cost Options is:

- 50% deposit due by the end of Week 2, Term 1
- Remaining balance due by the end of Term 1

If charges are not paid, students may be placed in a lower-cost alternative.

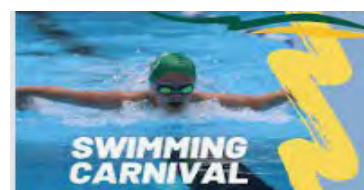

ALLOWANCES TO HELP WITH THE COSTS OF SCHOOLING - SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. The allowance consists of two components:

- Clothing Allowance - \$115 paid directly to the parent or the school.
- Educational Program Allowance - \$235 paid directly to the school.

Application is made by the parent or guardian for student/s enrolled in Years 7–12. The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age.

Eligibility Criteria

Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Centrelink Health Care Card.
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card.
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card (blue card).

The concession card must:

- Be valid for at least 4 weeks.
- Be valid for some time within Term 1.
- Have the student listed on it.
- Not be expired at the time of applying for SAS.

Electronic concession cards are also valid.

Emailed application can be accepted by the school if the applicant includes a copy of both sides of the concession card with the application form fully completed and signed.

Schools verify that the application form and concession card;

- match one another and
- meet the eligibility requirements.

Education Program Allowance - \$235.00

The Program Allowance is paid directly to the school to reduce contributions and charges.

Clothing Allowance - \$115.00

The Clothing Allowance is paid to the parent/guardian unless you indicate on the application form that you wish it to be paid to the school.

If payment to the parent/guardian is requested, the payment will be deposited into the parent/guardian's bank account.

Payments made to the school will offset any balance of contributions and charges on the student billing account.

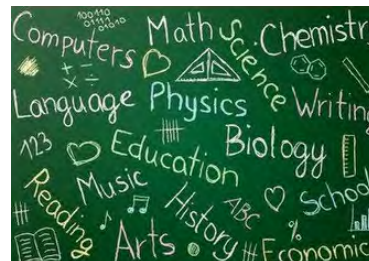
